











GEOGRAPHY: THE MAIN HIGHWAY IN AFGHANISTAN





Five schools for girls have been reopened by tribals elders in Paktia and girls now have the opportunity to attend as the school year in warmer climate areas has begun.




A week ago, the administration of schools in the Samkani district Gardiz city in Pak reopened five schools that had been closed for year.


